## Frequently asked questions

### WHAT CAN I EXPECT TO SEE BEING BUILT FOR THE COURSE SET-UP?

You can expect to see interlocking barricades and tape along the entire course. You will also see camera platforms, cabling, workforce shelters, portaloos and Games signage.

### WHAT IS A FAMILIARISATION SESSION?

A training session that enables Athletes to test the course.

### WHERE CAN I VIEW THE CYCLING TIME TRIAL?

The Time Trial can be viewed anywhere along the course. The main vantage points are the Start/Finish at Catani Gardens, St Kilda where there are spectator viewing areas, as well as the turnaround points at Black Rock for the women's event and Mentone for the men's.

### CAN PEDESTRIANS CROSS THE COURSE?

Please note that the entire course is lined with pedestrian barriers and/or tape. Pedestrians should check with a Volunteer or Victoria Police member in the vicinity to ensure it is safe to cross at one of the 53 strategically located crossing points along the course.

### I LIVE OR WORK ON THE COURSE, HOW WILL THESE TEMPORARY ARRANGEMENTS AFFECT ME?

You will be able to enter/exit the area at the local vehicle access points (see map inside). If you live or work on the foreshore side of the course, access is available from approximately 3.30pm Monday 20 March to 7am Tuesday 21 March at local vehicle access points.

If you live on the foreshore side of St Kilda Street between Head Street and Royal Brighton Yacht Club you will need to make sure you are aware of the local vehicle access times and points listed in this document (see map inside).

### HOW WILL OTHER PEOPLE, LIKE UNEXPECTED VISITORS OR MY RELATIVES, GET INTO AND OUT OF MY HOUSE?

Pedestrian access will be maintained. Use this advance notice to plan certain activities for you and your visitors around the temporary arrangements that will be put in place.

### WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE IS AN EMERGENCY AND I NEED POLICE, FIRE BRIGADE OR AMBULANCE?

Emergency service access will be maintained at all times.

### IF A TRADESMAN OR OTHER SERVICE PROVIDER NEEDS TO ACCESS MY HOUSE PLANNED OR UNPLANNED, WILL THEY BE ABLE TO GET ACCESS?

Yes, if the course is in use they will need to park as close as possible to an adjoining side street and walk to the property. Use this notice to plan in advance where possible.

### WHAT IF A WATER PIPE BURSTS AT MY PROPERTY WHILE THE ROADS ARE CLOSED?

If a water pipe bursts at your property while the roads are closed please turn the water off at the main and contact the relevant authority.

### WILL ANYBODY ASSOCIATED WITH THE COMMONWEALTH GAMES NEED ACCESS TO MY PROPERTY?

It is unlikely that anybody associated with the Commonwealth Games will need any access to your property. In the unlikely event that access is required your permission will be requested in advance.

### WILL HOME HELP, MEALS ON WHEELS OR OTHER COMMUNITY SERVICES STILL BE ABLE TO ACCESS MY HOME DURING THE ROAD EVENTS?

Community services will be able to access your property according to the information provided in this brochure. Your local council or service provider will inform you of any changes to the provision of community services if required.

# Cycling Time Trial Monday 20 and Tuesday 21 March 2006



## Event details

The Cycling Time Trial takes in one of Melbourne's traditional competitive and recreational cycling locations, the foreshore of St Kilda and scenic Beach Road. Competitors in the event depart at one-minute intervals to face the challenge of maintaining their speed and concentration in a personal battle against the course, the elements and the clock.

### TUESDAY 21 MARCH 2006 – RACE DAY

Women's Event (29km): 10.30am – 12.15pm  
Men's Event (40km): 1pm – 4pm

## Road closures and traffic changes

The event route (please see map inside), will follow these roads:

- Beaconsfield Parade
- Jacka Boulevard
- Marine Parade
- Ormond Esplanade
- St Kilda Street
- Esplanade
- Beach Road.

These roads will be closed to all through traffic for both events from approximately 9am Monday 20 March to 5.30pm Tuesday 21 March. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times to all properties on these streets. However, vehicle access will be restricted at certain times and locations. Please read this important community update to ensure you are aware of these arrangements.

## CONTROLLED RESIDENT AND BUSINESS VEHICLE ACCESS POINTS

From approximately 3.30pm Monday 20 March to 7am Tuesday 21 March, local residents and businesses will be able to access the area via the local vehicle access points listed inside. Residents and businesses on the foreshore side of St Kilda Street, Brighton, will also be able to access their local streets via the access points.

If you need to use your vehicle outside of these access times you will need to park on the east side of St Kilda Street.

## LOCAL VEHICLE ACCESS POINTS

From approximately 3.30pm Monday 20 March to 7am Tuesday 21 March, residents can enter Beach Road, Esplanade, Ormond Esplanade or Marine Parade via the closest local vehicle access point and drive carefully along the Cycling Time Trial course to their destination.

## BEACH ROAD BETWEEN BALCOMBE ROAD AND NAPLES ROAD

Residents living near the women's turnaround point (between Balcombe Road, Black Rock and Naples Road, Mentone) will be able to access their properties via the local vehicle access points at Beach Road/Reserve Road and Beach Road/Charman Road, from approximately 3.30pm Monday 20 March to 7am Tuesday 21 March.

## BEACH ROAD BETWEEN NAPLES ROAD AND WARRIGAL ROAD

Residents living near the men's turnaround point (83A Beach Road, located between Naples Road and Mentone Parade) will be able to access their properties as follows:

- between Naples Road and number 83A Beach Road: vehicle access from the north only from approximately 3.30pm Monday 20 March to 7am Tuesday 21 March; enter via local vehicle access point at Charman Road
- between 84 Beach Road and Mentone Parade: unrestricted vehicle access from the south only at Warrigal Road.

## CAR PARK ACCESS TIMES

All car parks accessed from the course will close from approximately:

- 9pm on Sunday 19 March to 3.30pm Monday 20 March
- 9pm on Monday 20 March to 6pm Tuesday 21 March.

You may not be able to remove vehicles left in these car parks during these times.

## BRIGHTON BEACH STATION CAR PARK

Vehicles will not be able to exit or enter the car park from approximately:

- 9am – 3.30pm Monday 20 March
- 7am – 5.30pm Tuesday 21 March.

Vehicles left in this car park while access is unavailable must remain in the car park until the road reopens. Access will be via South Road only.



## WASTE COLLECTION

Waste collection for Bayside City Council will occur on its usual day. However, properties on the foreshore side of St Kilda Street, on Beach Road or in streets only accessible from Beach Road will have to bring their bins in early. Bayside City Council will directly notify those residents that will need to comply with earlier than usual collection and retrieval of bins. There will be no changes to waste collection arrangements for City of Kingston during this time.

## POSTAL SERVICES

For security reasons, Australia Post postal bins along the course may be sealed on the morning of Monday 20 March until the evening of Tuesday 21 March. Mail deliveries to properties along the course will not be affected.

## TOW-AWAY ZONES, EXCLUSION ZONES AND CAR PARKING

All roads in and immediately around the course will become No Stopping Tow-Away zones. Residents are asked to take note of signed changes to roadside parking.

Vehicles are not permitted to park on nature strips in and around the course.

## QUEEN'S BATON RELAY

The relay goes through the City of Kingston on Thursday 2 March and Bayside City Council on Monday 13 March. Contact your local council for further information.

## BUILDING WORKS

Please plan ahead if you are on the closed section of the road and have building or other types of work scheduled at your property. Streets, nature strips and footpaths on the course must be clear of hoardings, builders' huts, skips, building materials, machinery or any other construction materials.

Please remember to advise builders or service providers that access restrictions will apply to your property from Monday 20 to Tuesday 21 March. Vehicles must be parked on your property or in neighbouring streets prior to the course becoming a secure zone.
